COMPACT training for 2018 continues the momentum

The 2017 year produced multiple new courses enhancing WCIA's existing COMPACT trainings and Reimbursement Programs. Consequently, members will see a refined program with **one important change** to the 2018 COMPACT Training requirements. **City Attorneys** no longer have to complete a WCIA training in 2018; however, WCIA will continue to offer CLE (Continuing Legal Education) credits to qualifying courses and provide new city attorney orientations as well as spring and fall pre-WSAMA sessions.

Members will again be required to attend three WCIA educational sessions and one session must be from the CORE topic training list. The CORE trainings continue to be correlated to areas of Audit Topic focus as well as programs emphasizing previous loss experience and/or best risk management practices. CORE topic categories include: Parks & Recreation, Employment, Law Enforcement, and Land Use or WCIA staff trainings. Delegates are still required to attend one WCIA training and one Full Board Meeting for COMPACT compliance.

We will roll out our 2018 COMPACT CORE Trainings topic list and eligible Reimbursement Programs in conjunction with Risk Services, prior to the Risk Management Reps March field audits. Questions on 2018 trainings can be directed to memberservices@wciapool.org.
