In December's newsletter we took a tour of several completed grant projects from 2025; here are a few more grant projects that were implemented across the state.

First to the **City of Pullman** where grant funds were used to match city funds for the purchase and installation of a new security door for the preschool at the City of Pullman Parks & Recreation Center. By integrating new technology, the City aims to significantly increase the effectiveness of its safety protocols.



Heading next to the **City of Covington**, in an effort to reduce tripping hazards, grant dollars were used to replace sidewalk panels at over 60 locations around the city.
